### Migration Working Group 2026-2027

Every academic year, the **Migration Working Group** (MWG) at the EUI invites advanced master's students, PhD researchers, post-doctoral fellows, and visiting scholars to present their latest research, exchange ideas, and discuss all topics related to migration. As a researcher-led initiative, we encourage participation from all levels of the EUI community.

Please indicate the current stage of your contribution (early draft or full paper) and if you have a preferred month to present. The deadline is Monday, 28 September.**

Our seminar series features **monthly sessions, beginning in October 2026 and resuming in May 2027**. Each time, two researchers present their papers. Each contributor chooses an individual discussant whose comments are followed by an audience Q&A. Sessions are hybrid, but we encourage and prefer in-person participation. We invite you to send us proposals for papers related to, but not limited to:

- Public attitudes towards migration
- Labour markets, welfare states, and migration policies
- Foreign aid, development, and criticism thereof
- Migration governance
- Migration narratives including in literature
- Integration, racism, and discrimination
- Border enforcement, migration controls, and mobility practices
- Technology in border migration
- Challenges to migrants' rights, migrant resistance, and agency
- Settlement in colonialism, and post-colonial discourse
- Forced migration, population exchange, exile, diaspora
- Abduction, human trafficking, and ransom
- Migration choices
- Emigration, brain drain, and remittance
- Trade and migration
- Seasonal migration, habitual migration, and nomadism
- Method and theory in the study of migration
